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Key Decisions & Strategic Initiatives

90 Days of Action & Reform

Over the past 90 days, the RCA Ad Hoc Committee, undertook a series of initiatives aimed at strengthening the foundations of cricket administration and development across Rajasthan. The Committee focused on improving governance, enhancing player welfare, expanding grassroots participation, supporting women's cricket, accelerating infrastructure development and introducing greater transparency in key processes. The following 39 decisions and initiatives reflect the Committee's efforts to create a more inclusive, professional and forward-looking ecosystem for cricket in the state.





1. Immediate Revocation of All Player Bans and Simplified NOC Process

All bans imposed on players across Rajasthan were revoked with immediate effect and it was clarified that any ban imposed without RCA's consent would be invalid. The NOC process was simultaneously overhauled, allowing players to directly approach RCA if their district association withheld clearance without valid reason.

2. Historic 100% Increase in TA-DA for Players, Paid Directly Online

Travel and daily allowances for players participating in state-level tournaments were doubled. For the first time payments were transferred directly to players' bank accounts online, eliminating middlemen and bringing full financial transparency to player payments.

3. Summer Coaching Camps Approved Across All 33 Districts

Summer coaching camps were approved and executed across all districts from April 15 to 30, the first time such a comprehensive state-wide programme was rolled out simultaneously. Camp grants were more than doubled from Rs 40,000 to Rs 1,00,000 per district enabling significantly better facilities, equipment and coaching quality.

4. Special Focus on Under-14, Under-16 and Under-19 Age Groups in Camps

Camps were specifically designed to identify and nurture players in the Under-14, Under-16 and Under-19 categories for both boys and girls. This created a structured talent pipeline for future state teams for the first time at this scale.



5. Women Players Formally Included in Summer Camp Programme

For the first time, girls in the Under-15 and Under-19 age groups were formally included in the district summer camp structure. This was a significant step towards expanding women's cricket at the grassroots level across all districts.



6. Senior Women's Championship Held Across 8 Districts Simultaneously

The state-level Senior Women's Championship was organised across 8 districts at the same time, a first in RCA history. Districts included Jaipur, Udaipur, Jodhpur, Alwar, Jhunjhunu, Rajsamand, Bhilwara and Bansawara giving every district's women players a competitive platform.

7. Senior Men's Colvin Shield Expanded to Multiple Venues

The Senior Men's Colvin Shield was hosted simultaneously across Jaipur, Jodhpur and Udaipur, breaking the long-standing tradition of a single venue. This gave more districts a chance to host matches and significantly more players an opportunity to participate.

8. Player Data Recording System Introduced

A scientific data recording system was introduced to track player performance across domestic tournaments. One click on the system would make a player's complete data available to selectors and coaches, bringing modern analytics to Rajasthan cricket.

9. Video Analysis of Matches Introduced

RCA decided to introduce video analysis of state-level matches on the lines of BCCI national tournaments. Existing trained staff were deployed to reduce additional costs while building a performance roadmap for young players.

10. Under-19 Women's Trophy — New Tournament Launched

A brand new Under-19 Women's Trophy was introduced to give young women players a high-level competitive platform. This was the first time such a dedicated tournament was created for this age group in Rajasthan's cricket history.



11. Match Format Changed to Multi-Day and League Structure

The Under-16 tournament format was changed to a multi-day format to give players more match experience. The Under-14 tournament was restructured to a hybrid format combining league and knockout stages.

12. Inspection of Chomp International Cricket Stadium Jaipur and Construction Accelerated

The committee inspected the under-construction international stadium on Delhi Road and reviewed construction quality and current progress. Meetings were held with Vedanta Group and Hindustan Zinc to accelerate the long-stalled project with the stadium now projected to be ready within two years.



13. Meeting with Hindustan Zinc to Restart Stadium Construction

A detailed and structured meeting was held with Hindustan Zinc representatives to revive the Chomp stadium project. Positive assurances were received and a joint committee was formed to oversee the next phase of construction and funding.



14. Inspection and Revival Plan for Barkatullah Khan Stadium Jodhpur The committee visited the long-neglected Barkatullah Khan Stadium and assessed its main ground, wickets, pavilion, gymnasium and academy in detail. A roadmap was prepared to upgrade it to IPL and international standards and restore regular cricket activity to Jodhpur.

15. Inspection of Proposed Stadium Site in Udaipur The land allocated at Gram Kheda near the Udaipur-Chittorgarh highway was inspected for the proposed international cricket stadium. Adani Group was contacted for support and a coordination plan was set in motion with the Udaipur District Cricket Association.

16. Denmark Exchange Programme — International Agreement

RCA initiated an exchange programme with Denmark Cricket, the first international collaboration of its kind for Rajasthan cricket. Rajasthan players will tour Denmark and the Danish team will visit Jaipur, providing international exposure to players across all age groups in T20, ODI and Test formats.

17. Player Exchange Discussions Initiated with Australia Sri Lanka and USA

The convenor announced that exchange programme discussions were underway with cricket boards of Australia, Sri Lanka and the United States. This was aimed at giving Rajasthan's cricketers exposure to diverse international playing conditions and raising the overall standard of the game in the state.

18. Match Referee Workshop and Examination Conducted for the First Time

RCA conducted its first-ever formal match referee workshop and examination with applications invited from all district associations. Out of 33 applicants who appeared, 22 qualified, bringing a professional officiating structure to domestic cricket for the first time.

19. Curator and Ground Staff Seminar Planned Across All Districts

A seminar for RCA panel curators and ground staff was decided upon to improve pitch quality across all district venues. The plan included creating a pool of trained pitch curators at the district level so every venue could produce quality playing surfaces.





20. High-Tech Wicket Preparation Programme Initiated

The committee planned to involve BCCI-empanelled curators and RCA's experienced ground staff to prepare high-quality pitches at district centres. The focus was on developing wickets matching IPL and international standards to improve player experience and match quality.

21. RCA Panel Video Analyst Team to be Formed

A decision was taken to constitute an RCA panel of video analysts and organise training seminars for interested candidates across all districts. This was aimed at bringing structured performance analysis to state-level cricket fully on the lines of BCCI national tournaments.

22. Former Players' Committee Formed for Domestic Cricket Calendar

A committee of former players was constituted to help shape the domestic cricket calendar and activity framework for the coming season. Their inputs would be reviewed alongside district association feedback before finalising the schedule.

राजस्थान क्रिकेट संघ (आरसीए) एडहॉक कमेटी राज्य में उच्च स्तरीय क्रिकेट मैदान एवं गुणवत्तापूर्ण विकेट तैयार करने की दिशा में महत्वपूर्ण पहल करने जा रही है। आरसीए एडहॉक कमेटी संयोजक डॉ. मोहित जसवंत यादव ने बताया कि आरसीए

क्रिकेट मैदानों की उपलब्ध सुविधाओं की समीक्षा एवं प्रतिनिधियों के साथ गहन चर्चा के बाद आवश्यक मापदंडों को पूरा करने वाले मैदानों के चयन की प्रक्रिया को अंतिम रूप दिया गया है। संयोजक डॉ. यादव ने कहा कि आरसीए एडहॉक कमेटी राज्य के प्रतिभावान खिलाड़ियों को आगामी बीसीसीआई घरेलू क्रिकेट सत्र की तैयारियों

23. Transparent Selection Process with Online Applications from Former Players

Online applications were invited from former players to constitute Men's, Junior and Women's selection committees for 2026-27. All eligible applicants were given the opportunity to appear for interviews in a fully transparent and open process, a significant governance improvement.

24. Rule Strictly Implemented that Selectors Cannot Be Linked to Cricket Academies

Implemented strictly that no person linked to a cricket academy could serve on any RCA selection committee. This was a significant step aimed at eliminating conflict of interest and ensuring selections were made purely on merit.

25. Audit Reports Sought from All District Associations

All district cricket associations under RCA were directed to submit their financial audit reports for 2023-24 and 2024-25. This was part of a broader push for financial accountability and transparency across the entire cricket ecosystem.

26. District-Level Cricket Infrastructure Review Undertaken

The committee reviewed the state of sports infrastructure across all districts and worked with local bodies to improve grounds. A plan was prepared to make district venues capable of hosting state-level tournaments so cricket could spread beyond the major cities.



27. Social Media Live Streaming of State-Level Matches Planned

A decision was taken to live stream state-level matches on social media platforms to increase public visibility of Rajasthan cricket. This was aimed at creating a wider fan base and providing greater recognition to talented players from smaller districts.

28. NCA Under-16 High Performance Camp Successfully Hosted in Jaipur

RCA hosted the BCCI NCA Centre of Excellence Under-16 High Performance Camp at RCA Academy and SMS Stadium. This was a significant recognition of Jaipur as a credible national training venue and gave Rajasthan's young players direct exposure to top national coaching.

29. After 12 Years a Rajasthan Player Manav Suthar was Selected for Indian Test Team

Rajasthan's Manav Suthar was selected for the Indian Test team, becoming the state's first Test cricketer in 12 years. This was a direct result of the improved cricket environment and opportunities being created in Rajasthan under the new administration.

30. Six Rajasthan Players Selected for BCCI Under-19 National Camps

Six players from Rajasthan were selected for BCCI's Under-19 High Performance Camp based on their performances in the national tournament. Three women players were also selected for the BCCI Under-19 Women's High Performance Camp held at Surat.

31. Full Operational Support Provided for IPL 2026 in Jaipur

The committee deployed RCA's ground staff, curators, scorers, umpires, media team and local liaison officers for all IPL matches in Jaipur. The grounds were prepared to the highest standards and received specific praise from visiting teams including Delhi Capitals and their support staff.

32. Proposal Submitted to State Sports Council for More Matches at SMS Stadium

RCA submitted a formal proposal to the State Sports Council to host the maximum number of domestic matches at SMS Stadium throughout the year. The purpose was to benefit players and sports council to engage more players and also proper maintenance of the stadium.

33. Five-Point Reform Programme Publicly Announced

The committee publicly announced a five-point reform agenda covering transparency, impartial selection, neutral selectors, development of cricket infrastructure and improvement of district-level cricket activities. This was widely covered across major newspapers as a defining statement of the committee's intent and direction.



34. Dedicated Committee Formed for 2026-27 Domestic Cricket Calendar

A dedicated seven-member committee was formed under the chairmanship of Arisht Singhvi specifically to prepare the domestic cricket calendar for 2026-27. The committee was tasked with submitting its report quickly to enable timely planning and smooth commencement of the cricket season.

35. Structured Feedback Taken from All 33 District Associations

The committee held structured feedback sessions with representatives of all 33 district cricket associations to understand ground-level problems. Issues raised were systematically documented and directly used to shape decisions on tournaments, infrastructure and player welfare.



36. Comprehensive Financial Year 2026-27 Cricket Calendar Prepared

A comprehensive cricket calendar for the 2026-27 domestic season was prepared covering all age groups and formats for both men and women. This was the first time such a structured and forward-looking calendar was prepared by an ad hoc committee in RCA's history.



37. Colvin Shield Closing Ceremony and Outstanding Player Felicitation Planned

An awards ceremony and felicitation event was planned for outstanding performers in the Colvin Shield tournament. This was aimed at giving public recognition to talented players from across the state and motivating greater participation in future seasons.

38. Summer Camp Closing Ceremony Attended by Rajasthan Legislative Assembly Speaker

The closing ceremony of summer camps in Jhunjhunu district was attended by the Speaker of the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly, Vasudev Devnani, who personally felicitated players and praised the initiative. This represented significant political and institutional endorsement of the committee's grassroots cricket development

39. Comprehensive Roadmap Presented for Future of Rajasthan Cricket

As the tenure progressed, the committee presented a comprehensive roadmap for the future of cricket in Rajasthan covering infrastructure, talent development, women's cricket, international exposure and governance reforms. This roadmap was designed to serve as the foundation for whoever leads RCA going forward, ensuring that the gains of these 90 days are not lost but built upon systematically.



The Impact of Reform

13 Transformational Benefits for Rajasthan Cricket

The initiatives undertaken during this period were designed not only to address immediate priorities but also to create long-term value for Rajasthan cricket. Through a combination of policy reforms, developmental programmes, infrastructure initiatives and player-focused interventions, the RCA Ad Hoc Committee sought to strengthen the overall cricketing ecosystem across the state. The following 13 outcomes highlight the key benefits and positive impact generated through these efforts, reflecting progress towards a stronger, more transparent and opportunity-driven future for cricket in Rajasthan.





1. Players Were Put First and the System Was Redesigned Around Them

Players became the centre of every decision and got immediate and tangible benefits. Bans were revoked and a clear rule was established that no player could be banned without RCA's consent. NOC restrictions were removed so players could directly approach RCA if a district association withheld clearance. Academy-linked selectors were disqualified to eliminate conflict of interest. Selection criteria were made public and transparent interviews were introduced so that every deserving player had a fair and equal opportunity to be considered purely on merit.

2. Financial Reforms Strengthened

Financial reforms were introduced to ensure that resources reached players and districts more effectively. TA-DA was doubled and transferred directly into players' bank accounts online, bringing greater convenience and transparency to the process. District camp grants were significantly increased enabling better facilities and coaching quality at the ground level. A monthly maintenance proposal was also submitted to the State Sports Council to generate sustainable venue revenue for RCA, bringing greater financial structure and discipline to the organisation's long-term operations.

4. Women's Cricket Given Serious Institutional Standing

Women's cricket moved from being an afterthought to a structured programme with its own tournaments, camp allocations and national selections. The Senior Women's Championship across 8 districts, the new Under-19 Women's Trophy and three players selected for BCCI national camps signalled that women's cricket was now a genuine priority.

3. Grassroots Cricket Scaled Up Dramatically

The reach of organised cricket in Rajasthan expanded from a handful of major cities to all 33 districts simultaneously. Summer camps, multi-venue tournaments and district-level infrastructure development meant that a talented young player in Sirohi or Dungarpur now had the same access to structured cricket as one in Jaipur.



5. A Clear Talent Pipeline Built from Under-14 to Senior Level

For the first time, a structured pathway existed for a player from Under-14 camps all the way through to senior selection. Data recording systems, video analysis, revised tournament formats and transparent selection processes meant that talent could now be identified, tracked and developed systematically rather than by chance.

6. National Recognition and BCCI Confidence Regained

Rajasthan's standing with BCCI improved measurably during this period. Hosting the NCA Under-16 High Performance Camp, having Manav Suthar selected for the Indian Test team, getting nine players into various BCCI national camps and receiving praise from the IPL Commissioner for ground quality all signalled that Rajasthan cricket was back on the national radar.

7. International Exposure and Global Partnerships Created

The Denmark exchange programme and ongoing discussions with Australia, Sri Lanka and USA opened an entirely new chapter for Rajasthan cricket. For the first time, young players from the state had a realistic pathway to play and train internationally, raising the overall aspirational ceiling for an entire generation of cricketers.



8. Infrastructure Revival After Years of Neglect

Three major stadiums that had been either stalled or neglected for years were given serious attention. The Chomp international stadium construction was restarted, the Barkatullah Khan Stadium in Jodhpur was inspected and a revival plan created, and the Udaipur stadium site was activated. Combined with the curator and ground staff programme, Rajasthan's physical cricket infrastructure was finally moving forward.

9. Professionalism Introduced into Match Operations

The introduction of formal match referees, video analysts, trained curators and structured scorers brought a level of professionalism to Rajasthan's domestic cricket that had not existed before. Matches were now being conducted with systems similar to BCCI national tournaments, raising standards across the board.

10. Supported IPL 2026 in Jaipur with Full Operational Commitment

RCA treated IPL Season 19 as a moment of pride for Rajasthan and a demonstration of the state's capability to deliver for Indian cricket at the highest level. The committee mobilised its full ground staff, curators, umpires, scorers and media personnel, working in close coordination with BCCI and the government at every stage.





11. Government and Institutional Support Mobilised By engaging the Chief Minister, Sports Minister, State Sports Council, Legislative Assembly Speaker and Denmark's ambassador, the committee elevated RCA's conversations from administrative to strategic. Government support was secured for stadium construction, venue maintenance and cricket development in a way that had not happened in recent memory.

12. Governance Reforms That Will Outlast This Tenure Many of the reforms introduced, including the no-academy rule for selectors, online application processes, mandatory audit reports, transparent selection interviews and the domestic calendar committee, are structural changes that will continue to benefit Rajasthan cricket regardless of who leads RCA next. The committee essentially future-proofed the organisation's governance architecture.

13. Hope and Belief Restored Across the Entire Cricket Ecosystem Perhaps the most intangible but most powerful achievement was the restoration of confidence among players, coaches, district officials and fans that Rajasthan cricket was being run with genuine intent. The convenor's own statement that every day is precious captured a spirit of urgency and care that had been absent for years, and that spirit visibly energised everyone connected to the game across the state.
